



TEMPORARY RESIDENT VISA

REQUIREMENTS:

1. Make an appointment <https://mexitel.sre.gob.mx/citas.webportal/pages/public/login/login.jsf>
2. Visa application form
3. Valid passport
4. One photo passport size (without glasses)
5. Fee \$40.00 usd
6. Comply with original or certified documents required according to the category:

CATEGORIES:

a) Economic Solvency (choose one option)

- Proof of investment: Bank statements (last 12 months) with monthly balance overall to \$32,000 usd per-person.
- Proof of income from employment/pension: Bank statements (last 6 months) with monthly income of at least \$1,900 usd per-person.

b) Family unit with Student /Temporary resident

- Son/daughter (minors): Birth certificate of the child and temporary resident card/visa holder.
- Parents (minors): Birth certificate of the applicant and temporary resident visa/card
- Spouse or common-law partner: marriage certificate or common-law certificate or equivalent and temporary resident card/visa holder
- Child of the spouse or common-law partner or equivalent, must provide that the applicant is a child or an adolescent who is not married: applicant's birth certificate and marriage or common-law certificate and temporary resident card/visa holder
 - Proof of economic solvency to support the family with investments: bank statements showing an average monthly balance more than \$600 usd (12 months) per-person or proof of income: bank statements with monthly income of more \$600 usd (6 months) per-person.

c) Family unit with Permanent resident

- Spouse or common-law partner: marriage certificate or common-law certificate or equivalent and permanent resident card/visa holder.
 - Proof of economic solvency to support the family with investments: bank statements showing an average monthly balance more than \$600 usd (12 months) per-person or employment/pension with monthly income greater than \$600 USD (6 months).

d) Family unit with Mexican citizen

- Spouse or common-law partner: marriage certificate or common-law certificate or equivalent and document proving Mexican nationality

e) Investor

- Deed or policy from a Mexican corporation signed before a Commissioner of Oaths, or a document duly certified by the administrative body or a competent officer thereof, stating that the foreigner has shares in the capital stock of the Mexican corporation, and that the amount of the investment effectively disbursed for the foreigner's share in the corporation would exceed \$129,000 usd.
- Document proving the ownership of personal property (company in Mexico) by the foreigner, with a value exceeding \$129,000 usd.
- Documents proving business activities in Mexican territory, which could be proven by: contracts, service orders, invoices, licenses and permits, and a certificate issued by IMSS proving that the foreigner employs at least 3 employees

f) Real estate property in national territory

- Public Deed signed before a Commissioner of Oaths certifying that the foreigner is the holder of real estate property with a value exceeding \$259,000 usd

g) Letter invitation from an organization or a public or private institution

- Letter invitation from a public or private organization or institution of renowned integrity inviting the foreigner to participate in a non-remunerated activity in Mexican territory. Letter must include: Applicant's name & nationality, inst. name, registration number, purpose of organization, address and contact info of the organization, activity and length, and state who will be paying for expenses.
- Copy of the official identification of the person signing the letter of invitation
- If the institution is going to cover expenses: investment receipts or bank statements showing an average monthly balance of over \$64,000 usd (12 months).
- In the event that the inviting institution will not cover living expenses: investment receipts or bank statements showing an average monthly balance of over \$32,000 usd (12 months) or a salary or pension of over \$1,200 usd (6 months)

h) Scientific research in jurisdictional waters of Mexico

- Communication through which the Embassy of the applicant's country of nationality or residence in Mexico notifies the foreigner that the Mexican Ministry of Foreign Affairs (SRE) received authorization from the competent national authorities. Letter must include: Applicant's name & nationality, inst. name, activity and length.
